

A Word from Pastor Tim:

"Train up a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not depart from it." Proverbs 22:6

When I was young, I did not understand the value of a good upbringing because I didn't think my parents influenced me very much. I thought I was my own person. An individual. But as I've grown, I've realized how many of their habits and attitudes I have developed. It's actually a bit scary. As I look at my kids, I see the same thing.

Remember the old commercial where the kid says, "I learned it by watching you, Dad." In that commercial, the child was referencing something negative they had learned. In the scripture above, we think of it in terms of positive things children learn from their parents. Both are equally true and important. We are training our kids, even long after they're grown.

The question is, are we training them in the way they should go? Or are we unintentionally teaching them things we don't want them to learn? For example, are we teaching them that a relationship with God is not very important? Are we teaching them that the Bible adds no value to our life? Are we teaching them that church participation is a chore that we should avoid when we can?

Most people would scoff at these questions. But are we not teaching them this with the many excuses that we make for not prioritizing church participation? Might they learn that football is more important than God, baseball is more important than God, fishing, yardwork, and so on? Perhaps they're learning that church is a valuable thing only when you can't find a good excuse not to go. Do they see us reading our Bibles, spending time in prayer, discussing scripture with our spouse?

At some point we are going to give up our hold on this physical world, breathe our last, and enter that eternal kingdom. After that, our children will carry on the habits they have witnessed in us. The choices we make are not solely about what experiences we want them to have now, but also what habits we want to instill in them. Do you want your children, whether they're small or grown, to have a better relationship with God in the years to come? If so, what are you doing now that will teach them and instill in them a habit that will live on after you're gone?

<u>Recipe Corner</u>

NO BAKE COCONUT PIE by beasley's bend fce

Instant Coconut Cream Pudding Mix (1 box) Milk (2 cups) Shredded Sweetened Coconut Flakes (2 cups) Cool Whip (8 oz container) 9-inch Graham Cracker Crust

Add Coconut Cream Pudding Mix to a large bowl and mix with 2 cups of milk until smooth. Fold in 2 cups Cool Whip. Add ³/₄ cup of shredded coconut to the pudding mix. Spread into pie crust, cover, and refrigerate overnight.

Toast the remaining coconut by placing in a small, dry skillet over med-low heat. Stir constantly so it doesn't burn. Right before your desired cooking color, place it on a plate. The coconut will continue to brown. Placing the coconut on a plate will help stop the cooking process.

When ready to serve, take the pie from the fridge and spread the remaining Cool Whip on top and garnish with the toasted coconut.
