A Word from Pastor Tim:

As many of you know, I had a wonderful opportunity to spend about 2 1/2 weeks in Greece and Turkey walking the footsteps of Paul and touring the cities and churches of the New Testament. This was an incredibly enlightening experience that taught me a great deal. I have had people ask me about my experiences, but I must admit, it's a little hard to share sometimes. It was 2 1/2 weeks, the days were long, they were packed with information and experiences, and that's a lot to try to share in a quick conversation.

For this reason, I feel led to share these experiences with you during our worship gatherings this summer. I know that during the summer months people often find more excuses to miss church on Sunday morning than any other time of the year. I just want to caution you, that may be a mistake. You don't want to miss what we have in store for you this summer.

Starting May 26, we will spend 4 Sundays discussing the 7 letters to the 7 churches listed in Revelation 2-3. I visited 6 of the 7 churches in Turkey. I will install temporary screens in the sanctuary in order to utilize a handful of pictures during these messages.

June 23, we will welcome Crossroads Mission's team as they help lead our 1st Responders Sunday. There will be a meal after the service and a gift for all 1st Responders in attendance.

June 30, we will follow the tradition of all Methodist churches in this area, we will have Laity Sunday. The laity of the church will lead the entire service with Dr. Clint Satterfield delivering the message.

In July, we will begin a new series on the Footsteps of Paul covering 5 locations in Greece and one in Turkey not discussed in June. Again, I will be utilizing my pictures from the trip as illustrations. This series will continue through August 11th.

As the excuses to miss worship this summer start coming into your life, remember that Sunday morning attendance is a Saturday night decision. I hope and pray that you will decide to spend some time with us on Sunday morning this summer.

Recipe Corner

STRAWBERRY PIE By Linda McDonald

1 pie shell 1 quart strawberries 1 1/2 C. water 3/4 C. sugar 2 Tbsp. cornstarch 1 small pkg. strawberry Jello Cool whip

Bake 1 refrigerated pie crust according to package directions. Let it cool completely.

Stir water and corn starch over medium heat until thick and clear.

Add Jello and stir until dissolved.

Arrange strawberries in pie shell and pour Jello mixture over them.

Let cool and store in refrigerator.

Top with cool whip when served.
