As some of you may be aware, our church operates in a connectional system. That means that every four years, Methodists from around the globe gather for a legislative session known as General Conference where they set standards and policies for our shared life together. This most recently occurred at the beginning of May. There were a lot of decisions made that will have a direct effect on us as a local congregation.

You may have seen some of these discussed in the news. I cannot list everything that was done in an article of this size. There is simply too much. Here are the highlights. LGBTQ individuals can now be pastors, pastors can perform same-sex weddings, they can be hosted in UM churches, marriage has been redefined to accommodate this, pastors will no longer be disciplined for adultery, the church no longer teaches against adultery, a new pro-choice statement on abortion was adopted, the UMC has committed to divest from Israel, apportionment dollars will be given to promote the acceptance of LGBTQ lifestyles in America, as well as other changes. I encourage you to search these out for yourself. I would be happy to send you some links or print out some materials for you to read over if you would like.

The council will but discussing this as well. So, I encourage you to talk to me and to talk to your leaders to be well informed on everything. And to be present at all meetings so that your voice is heard and incorporated into the work of the church as we move forward.

Please keep in mind that my door is always available for anyone, members and nonmembers, to come and discuss any aspect of this.

For those that are apprehensive with these changes rest assured, the activities of our congregation will not change. We will continue to love one another, regardless of where opinions differ. We will continue to welcome everyone into our church. We will continue to worship the Lord in spirit and in truth. Our services will not change. And the way we treat each other will not change.

Once Paul Carroll created some drama as he suffered a severe cut on his hand from the pitcher pump of the well outside. He had to get stitches. I am sure he still has the scar, if Paul still is. If he isn't, I'm sure God has made his hand perfect again. "Oh, I remember, I remember," sings Bob Seger.

The month of June has always seemed slow, cozy and loving to me. The days are long with light and a gentle feel. A sigh of relief to know that the bloom of flowers is near and the fresh, garden vegetables are on their way. See how God loves us? See how God loves us? Let June bring out the best in all of us. Fresh Fruit Salad with Goat Cheese By Natalie Knudsen

2 c. blueberries2 c. strawberries2 c. watermelon3-4 fresh basil leaves4 oz. blueberry goat cheese

Dice strawberries and watermelon to match the size of the blueberries and place in a large bowl. Cut goat cheese into 8-10 pieces. Slice basil leaves into thin strips. Add goat cheese and basil to fruit, stirring carefully.

The goat cheese will thin out into a dressing or coating on the fruit.

Chill for several hours to blend flavors.
