#### A Word from Pastor Tim:

Pastor David Lay and family

Currently serving as Pastor at Hohenwald First United Methodist Church. He will be starting his 27th year of experience in pastoral ministry at the end of June. He has served United Methodist churches throughout Middle Tennessee as part of the Tennessee Conference and the Tennessee-Western Kentucky Conference. Pastor Lay was commissioned as a Deacon in 1998 and an Elder in full Connection in 2003.

Originally from Savannah, TN, in Hardin County, David has worked with children and youth in treatment facilities for behavioral problems, as well as a social worker in a nursing home, before receiving the call to ministry. 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#### Recipe Corner

### Scalloped Pineapple By Natalie Knudsen

3/4 cup sugar
3 Tablespoons flour
1 cup grated cheddar cheese
1 (20 oz) can pineapple tidbits
4 Tablespoons melted butter
1 stack pack Ritz crackers

Mix sugar and flour in bowl. Add grated cheese and drained pineapple (reserve juice). Mix well. Place in shallow casserole dish and spring small amount of reserved juice over mixture. Combine crushed cracker crumbs with melted margarine and sprinkle over pineapple mixture. Bake at 350 for 25-30 minutes or until bubbly and cheese is melted. This is an excellent side dish with baked ham!!
