A Word from Pastor Tim:

"you are to seek the place the Lord your God will choose." Deuteronomy 12:5

In this scripture, God is instructing the Israelites on their worship practices. He is telling them that they are not like other people who get to choose where they will worship. To be a child of God means that God determines where we worship.

The implication for us as Christians today is that we should not choose the church we attend based on whether or not we conform to their theological beliefs, and enjoy the ethos of their services. Or because we have family and friends that attend that church. Our choice should be based on one thing and one thing only-where does God want me worship and serve him?

For me, and my family, we believe God is calling us to a new place. While we have made many great friends and have loved our time here in Hartsville, we must follow the leading of the Holy Spirit as he instructs us for the next season of our life. Likewise, Rev. David Lay and his wife Penny have discerned, with the help of the Conference cabinet, that God is calling them to Hartsville. Having known David, I can tell you, he is a very likable and gentle man that I believe you will be very happy with him as your pastor.

David and I and our families model this behavior for you in this season. But it is the call of all Christians to continually be asking where God would have us attend, serve, live, and work. Most people are scared of this type of trust in God. But feel free to try it in the small mundane ways that it manifests itself. Next time you go out to eat, pray first and ask where God would have you worship him. Because we should be worshiping him all day every day, including in a restaurant. You may find that this practice helps you hear his leading better. And you may find him bringing you in contact with opportunities to declare his goodness like never before. Maybe there's a waitress that needs someone to come in that evening that will pray for them and bless them. You could be used for that assignment, if you'll only take a moment and ask God, "where do you want me to worship you?"
